Learners covered topics to facilitate and to support them in basic interactions and conversations in Irish. Learners engaged in activities to demonstrate their language acquisition and cultural awareness.

STUDY REQUIREMENT

4 weeks, 4 hours per week

- Engage with the Irish language through culture
- Explore the beginnings of the written language through learning about OGHAM and the origins of the Irish alphabet
- Discuss greetings, blessings and curses in the Irish language
- Discuss where you and your people come from
- Describe your family, your home and your interests
- Compare Irish names and gain an understanding of naming conventions in Irish
- Explore the cultural association of the language with mythology, sport and music
- Identify the Gaeltachtaí or Irish speaking areas where Irish is the main language of communication
